

## **ROLE DESCRIPTION**

**POST TITLE:** Volunteer Trainee Ranger based at Berry Head

**RESPONSIBLE TO:** Countryside Ranger and Engagement Officer

**WORKING HOURS:** 30 hours per week (incl some weekends/evenings)

**DURATION OF PLACEMENT:** 9-12 months

## MAIN PURPOSE OF THE ROLE:

This training opportunity offers the chance to gain valuable hands on experience with Torbay Coast and Countryside Trust's Ranger Team at Berry Head National Nature Reserve & Site of Special Scientific Interest:

- To assist in the practical maintenance of land managed by Torbay Coast and Countryside Trust effectively and in accordance with the overall aims of the Trust
- To conserve and survey wildlife habitats especially limestone grasslands and associated flora and fauna
- To preserve this internationally acclaimed heritage site with features of archaeological and historic interest
- To improve access to Torbay's coast and countryside for all abilities and maintain facilities for informal outdoor recreation
- To increase public awareness, understanding and enjoyment of the natural environment of Berry Head and its geological formation
- To balance the needs of farming, recreation, tourism and conservation in the countryside

The above overall aims will be carried out in line with Trust policies. The general duties and responsibilities involved in this work will be as follows:

- 1. Performing practical landscape, access and habitat enhancement work to a high standard as directed by the Countryside Manager, in particular strimming and raking the limestone grasslands
- 2. Assisting in the day-to-day running of a busy nature reserve by opening and closing toilets, visitor centre and assisting and advising the public, presenting a positive, helpful image at all times
- 3. Regularly patrolling and inspecting sites and emptying dog bins
- 4. Monitoring and surveying species of both plants and animals such as guillemot counts
- 5. Working with weekly volunteers to carry out a wide range of tasks from scrub removal to butterfly surveys
- 6. Periodic maintenance of site infrastructure such as fencing and benches
- 7. Seasonally assisting staff leading guided bat walks and public events and eventually leading independently



- 8. Feeding and carrying out daily welfare checks on livestock during spring and summer
- 9. Always observe all Health and Safety requirements as directed by the Countryside Manager
- 10. Undertaking any other duties as may be assigned from time to time, like representing the Trust at local events
