ROLE TITLE: Berry Head Volunteer

REPORTS TO: Berry Head Ranger Team

HOURS: Thursdays 0930-1500, early departures accepted but all volunteers required at the start of the session for health and safety reasons.

LOCATIONS: Berry Head National Nature Reserve. Occasionally nearby sites like Gillard Road Nature Reserve or Sharkham Point

PRIMARY ROLE: The ranger team run a practical volunteer session where we undertake tasks like cutting vegetation, raking and weeding, to fit in with our annual habitat management plan. Limestone grassland is a low-nutrient environment so after strimming we need help to remove the clippings to prevent nutritional enrichment. We are also keeping scrub and competing grasses at bay. In the summer we conduct butterfly surveys, as well as gathering botanical data about the unique flora at Berry Head, which does involve sitting on the ground for a protracted time.

These sessions are a great way to improve your identification skills and contribute to local conservation efforts. This role would suit any physically fit adult who is looking to engage with nature and other enthusiasts in an outdoor setting, regardless of the British weather!

- Adhere to Torbay Coast and Countryside Trust's Volunteer Code of Conduct
- Attend health and safety briefing at start of each session and follow instructions from Trust staff
- Always respect others and the environment
- Safe use of hand tools
